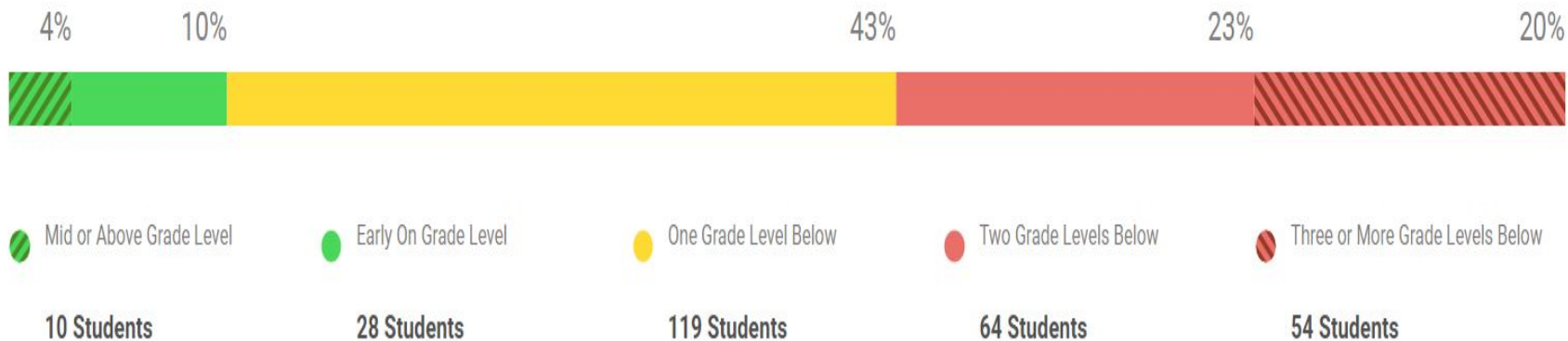

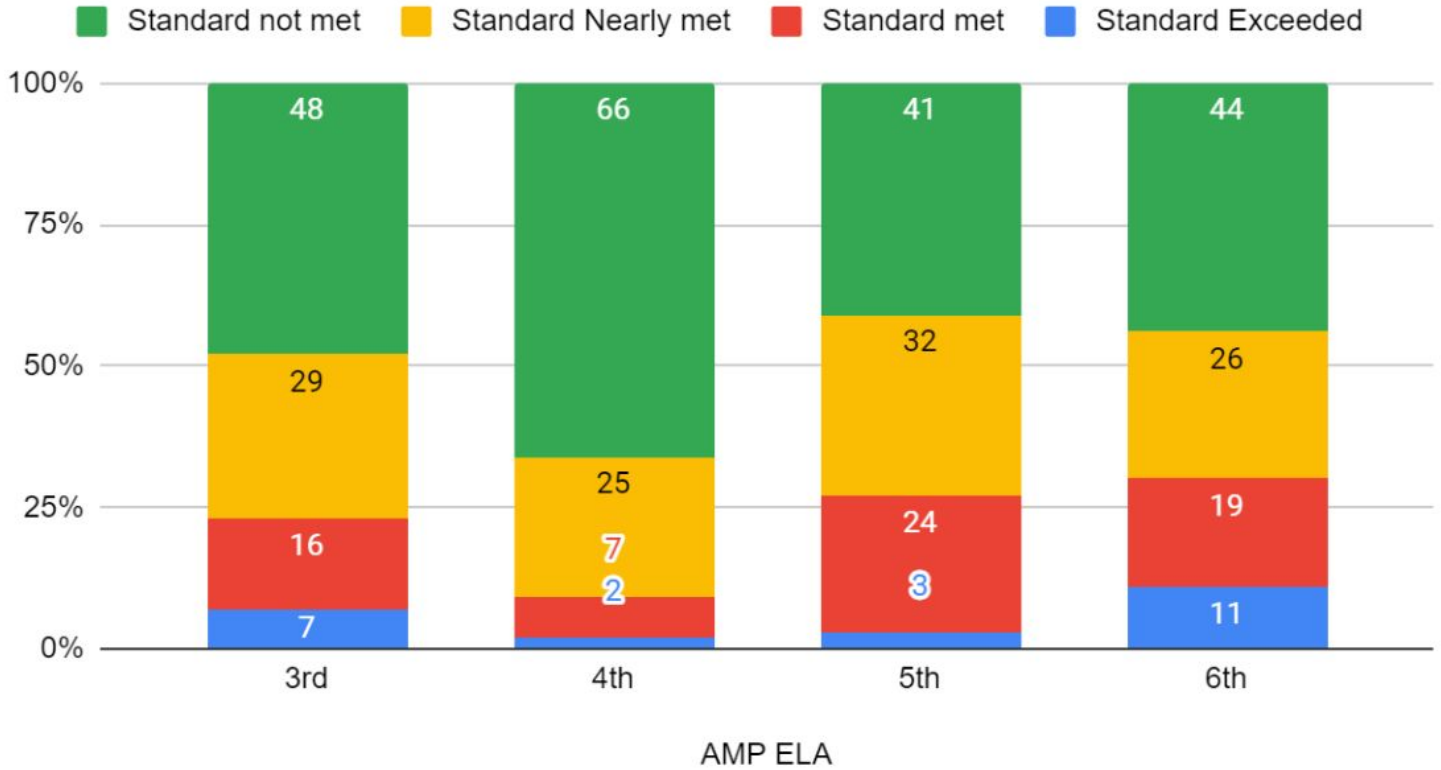

01

Classroom Instruction

Tier 1- Grade-level, rigorous instruction for ALL students

02

Classroom Intervention

Tier 1.5- Small groups facilitated by teacher and instructional aide

03

Reading Intervention-outside the classroom

Tier 2- Students more than two grade levels below, meet with Reading Intervention Staff 2-4x per week for 30 min.

04

Promoting LOVE of Reading

RESEARCH SHOWS THAT ATTENDANCE IS AN IMPORTANT FACTOR IN STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.

What is ADA (Average Daily Attendance = the total days of student attendance divided by the total days of instruction.

Aspen Meadow's ADA to date = 93.69%
GOAL IS 96%
